Report: August 2023

Road Safety Activity for Cambridge Curriculum (2023-24)

Delhi Public School, Vasant Kunj organized the Road Safety activities for Cambridge curriculum classes in the month of August in the school premises. This was aimed at creating awareness among young children of road safety measures and fostering responsible behavior on the roads. Basic concepts such as traffic lights, pedestrian crossings and road signs were introduced through colourful visual aids, discussion, videos, rhymes, and storytelling techniques.

EY-1 (Nursery – A)

Children engaged in Poem recitation 'Flashing Flashing Traffic lights 'followed by sharing road-crossing safety rules i.e., Stop, look and cross. Role-play activity was also conducted to make them aware of traffic rules and the use of zebra crossing.

EY-2 (Prep - A)

Activities were done by kids to make them aware of road safety. It started with a rhyme on traffic signal (Twinkle Twinkle traffic light). After this children performed role play of crossing the Road through the zebra crossing. The teacher instructed them about Dos and Don'ts to be followed while crossing the road.

STAGE 1 (1-A)

Road Safety Activities were conducted in 1A. The students learned about Traffic Lights and Zebra crossing by following Traffic lights that were displayed on roads where they were driving their toy vehicles. Then, they learned the Road Signs through Flash cards followed up by a Rhyme related to Traffic rules.

STAGE 2 (2-A)



with great enthusiasm and were rewarded with caps, games and books for giving the correct answer.




Report: April, 2023
